- We will read, listen to, retell and discuss a wide range of genres
- We will read , prepare and perform a range of different types of poetry
- We will discuss all features of non fiction texts

### As geographers

- We will use maps and atlases accurately, reading OS symbols and grid references
- We will describe physical features relating to our topic

### As musicians

- We will use Charanga to assess and appraise music 'Three Little Birds' and 'The Dragon Song'
- We will investigate music and early forms of musical instruments from the stone age

# As users of technology

- We will use coding software to debug algorithms
- We will use word/PowerPoint/ publisher to combine graphics, words and sounds to create a presentation for our class assembly

### As sports people

- We will use the 'Jigsaw' scheme
- Dreams and goals we will evaluate our own learning and identify how it can be better next time.

# As artists and designers

- We will use a colourwash to create a background for Stonehenge
- We will choose textiles for appearance and qualities to create a Mammoth

# As linguists

- We will be able to hold a short, simple conversation in French
- We will be able to read a short passage that uses familiar words

# In Religious Education

- We will answer the question Why is the bible important for Christians today?
- We will give examples of why and how Christians use the bible today and provide similarities and differences between different cultures.
- We will relate stories in the bible to our beliefs about Christianity

Each theme will start with a 'Talking Tub'. This activity allows the children to explore, texts, photographs, artefacts and resources to inspire and engage them and to encourage them to pose questions and take ownership of their curriculum themes

These are just some of the aspects of learning we will cover when we explore this theme. There will be opportunities to develop other subjects and there will lead the direction of the curriculum through their questioning
