Summer Term Week 6


JIGSAW The mindful approach to PSHE

Explain to children that they will soon be moving to a new class and that they may be feeling some of the emotions they have just acted out. 





Use the number line below if you need a little help.











Cut out the squares and put them in the right order.

Counting beyond 20



Can you count the chickens on the picture? Remember to say the next number as you point carefully to each chicken.

Parents/Guardians

As your child counts please encourage them to point carefully to each chicken saying the next number as they touch the picture. When they count from 21-29 point out the pattern e.g. that they are counting 1-9 but with 20 in front.

Find some items in your house that you can count such as toys, pasta, buttons, packets, tins, sweets etc.

Parents/Guardians
Try and find amounts of objects up to 30 for the children to count.

Encourage them to touch count each item.

- Ask someone in your family to give you a number between 1 and 20. Start at that number and count to 30.
- Ask them to give you

 the way up to 40?
- Ask them to give you a different number between 1 and 20.
 Can you count to 50?
