



Peak Plastic

· What are microplastics?

- Why are single-use plastics a problem?

- How are people taking action to tackle plastic pollution?

There are tiny plastics on a UK mountain. Scientists found them in a lake on Snowdon. It's the highest mountain in Wales. Snowdon is in a national park. It's a place where wildlife is protected.

A scientist says it's "likely" they came in the rain. They also say it's surprising to find plastic in a <u>remote</u> place! Microplastics are tiny pieces of plastic. They are less than 5mm. These plastics often break off from larger pieces.

So what is the problem with some plastics? Plastic is not always <u>biodegradable</u>. It takes hundreds of years to break down. A lot of it ends up in our oceans. Here, some animals can think its food. Wildlife group WWF says it can kill thousands of animals.


People, though, want to make a change. Next month, the UK will ban cotton buds and plastic straws. There are some exemptions.



In Mathematics the term 'area' is the space taken up by the shape.



<u>Maths lesson 5 - perimeter</u>


In Mathematics the term 'perimeter' is the length of all the outside edges of a shape added together.

Topic lesson 1 Wellbeing


