<b>Early Years Foundation Stage</b>	<p>Geography is embedded within the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum through the use of the learning environments and classroom provision. The children are given a wealth of opportunities to engage in activities, both child-initiated and adult-directed, which enable them to develop their knowledge of the world in which they live and to notice the human and physical features. During the children's time in Early Years Foundation Stage, the essential building blocks of geographical capability are established.</p> <p>Geography in the Early Years Foundation Stage is incorporated into all aspects of the curriculum. However, it can primarily be classified as part of 'Understanding the World', which includes the strands 'People, Culture and Communities' and 'The Natural World'.</p>
