Rising Threes	Development Matters – Birth to three Literacy - Enjoy drawing freely. Expressive Arts and Design - Start to make marks intentionally. - Explore paint, using fingers and other parts of their bodies as well as brushes and other tools. - Express ideas and feelings through making marks, and sometimes give a meaning to the marls they make.						
Nursery	Development Matters – 3 and 4 year olds Expressive Arts and Design Create closed shapes with continuous lines and begin to use these shapes to represent objects. Draw with increasing complexity and detail, such as representing a face with a circle and including details. Use drawing to represent ideas like movement or loud noises. Show different emotions in their drawings and paintings, like happiness, sadness, fear, etc. Explore colour and colour mixing. Show different emotions in their drawings – happiness, sadness, fear, etc.						
Reception	 Development Matters – reception Expressive Arts and Design Explore, use and refine a variety of artistic effects to express their ideas and feelings. Return to and build on their previous learning, refining ideas and developing their ability to represent them. Create collaboratively, sharing ideas, resources and skills.
