Educational Visits

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School Lunches

You will have had information about the changes we are making to our meal providers. We are moving away fro our current providers 'Dolce' and brining it inhouse so that our kitchen staff are part of Venn. There are many benefits to this change but one of the biggest differences is the cost. If you are not entitled to free school meals **you will be able to buy a hot meal and a pudding for £1.50 a day.** The new menus have been planned around what our children like to eat and we have hot puddings back on the menu. On a Friday, the children are able to vote for their favourite pudding (and we are convinced this will be chocolate crunch and custard).

Attendance

We have started to see a continued improvement in our attendance, especially in the number of children who have an attendance figure of less than 90%; those who are classed as persistent absentees. I have met with a number of parents and for some, this has been a very informative meeting as there has been a discussion about exactly how attendance impacts on learning. **We really do appreciate your support.**
