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

Year Six SATS Week

Every year, our children sit Statutory Assessment Tests in Year Six. This year the tests take place during the week beginning **Monday 13th May.** These tests are important—to the academy and to the children. They are used as a benchmark as the children move into Year Seven.

We are doing all we can at Marshland to get the children ready. Your child might have mentioned a resding program called **Reading Plus**. It would be great of you could support them with this at home. It is a new resource and we are already seeing the impact.

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Science

Science is one of the strengths at Marshland and the children really do get a rich, exciting curriculum offer. Mrs Stables (Y5 teacher) leads science at Marshland and she has worked hard on planning and resourcing the lessons

with all the class teachers. Some of the lessons are the type of lessons that the children will never forget! For example, the

children in Y4 have been investigating melting with ice and chocolate—with the added bonus that they got to taste the melted chocolate afterwards. Y3 children aren't just playing with balloons outside ... they have been investigating how seeds are dispersed and the balloons represent an example of this.



Attendance



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what3words

Download the free what3words app | what3words

We have been asked to share information about the what3words app. This is an app that provides you with 3 words which gives your exact location. The whole world has been split into three metre grids and using the app on your phone, it lets people know where you are. The app works with and without the use of the internet signal and is used by the emergency services, taxis and takeaways, etc. If your child has a phone, this could be a really useful way of making sure you know where they are. Marshland Mini-Police

Continuing with the idea of 'ambition' the Y5 children have had another session with South Yorkshire Police, developing their skills and knowledge as Mini Police. This session looked at investigating crime scenes.

The children had the opportunity to wear protective clothing, they learnt all about finger prints and how they are used and they also used magnifiers to look at evidence. We have our own CSI Marshland Team.
