## **Statutory Assessments**

Every year, our children sit Statutory Assessment Tests in Year Six. It really is a tough week for them and is simply a measure of how they perform in a grammar, punctuation and spelling paper, a reading test and three maths papers. This year, our Year Six children tackled the tests with resilience and determination and we are all very proud of them. Regardless of the results, they have all achieved so much this year. As we start to prepare to send them onto their different Y7s, we are looking forward to filling their final half-term at Marshland with amazing memories.

The next half-term also sees statutory assessments for our Year One children as they have to sit a Phonics Screening Check. Year Four children have to take a Multiplication Tables Check. Both these assessments take place during the second week in June. We are doing everything we can, but your help would be really appreciated. Over the half-term make sure your child is reading and if they are in Y4, use every opportunity to practise their times tables.



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# **Educational Visits**

Educational visits are such an important part of our curriculum offer and they help to create magical memories for our children. We have had a number of trips out since we returned after the Easter break and we've not even let the rain put us off! Y2 have just returned from Austerfield Study Centre—and the creatures came indoors out of the rain!

### **Building Work**

You will have noticed the building site being set up on the playground!

As we are part of Venn Academy Trust, we have been able to access improvement funds for the building. The building is not energy efficient and we need a new boiler. Instead of replacing the existing boiler, we have been very lucky to be given the funds to have an underground heat pump. Not only is this more energy efficient, it is also more environmentally friendly and there are very few schools that have them. Marshland will be at the forefront of new technology, which is very exciting.

There will, of course, be some disruption and we will keep you up-dated. The first thing you will notice is that we will not be able to access the school field as this is where the pipes are being installed. However, the new installation future-proofs the building and we are really pleased that we were successful in getting the funding for this.
